Required steps

- Plan the MA thesis during the semester before the final year of your graduation
- Contact potential supervisor (from the list below) with a basic idea
 - o clarify the need to enroll in specific modules
 - o discuss topic and supervision arrangement
 - submit a written proposal which consists of the following sections: abstract, research problem, research questions, methods, and a preliminary list of references
- Mutually sign supervision agreement, submit within the deadline (see below)
 Supervision agreement Master Thesis
- Book module Master Thesis only when all questions settled and schedule seems feasible
- Submit supervision agreement one year before intended graduation; allocate time to reach out to supervisor and potential advisors, especially during term-break

Supervision of the MA thesis

- Discuss ideas and research questions with the potential supervisor from an early stage onwards
- The topic must not have been covered by a previous written assignment
- Amount and quality of original language literature should be discussed with the supervisor at an early stage of the supervision
- All professors and lecturers teaching in the MAMES program are eligible for supervision. Arrange a consultation session with any of the lecturers below in order to discuss the feasibility of the topic and to arrange supervision.

Formal requirements

- 25 000 35 000 words (excluding cover page, table of contents and reference list; annexes are not part of the word count)
- Citation style and formatting: discuss with the supervisor
- Submission: One electronic copy each to the supervisor

Deadline for submission:

- The master thesis will be compiled over the course of two semesters
- The master thesis is awarded with 30 ECTS credits. In the case of failure, a new topic needs to be decided and the module Master thesis has to be booked anew
- Failure to submit the Master thesis according to the deadline (1 Dec/1 June) results in failure of the module Master thesis
- The thesis can be submitted earlier than the specified deadline but not later
